The petitioner has prayed for grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.74 dated 09.10.2021 registered under Sections 306, 34 of IPC at Police Station Patara, District Jalandhar.

On 26.11.2021, following order was passed:-

“Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.74 dated 09.10.2021 registered under Sections 306, 34 of IPC 1860 at Police Station Patara, District Jalandhar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner inter alia contends that Ranjit Singh @ Gora, who is the main accused has already been granted concession of interim bail by this Court vide order dated 29.10.2021 in CRM-M No.45530 of 2021.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Sandeep Vermani, Additional Advocate General, Punjab, who is present through video conferencing accepts notice on behalf of the State.

To come up on 14.01.2022.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest of the petitioner by the Arresting Officer, he shall be released on interim bail subject to the

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following conditions:-

- 1. That he shall make himself available for interrogation by a Police Officer, as and when required.*
- 2. That he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case, so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any Police Officer;*
- 3. That he shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.*

To be listed along with CRM-M No.45530 of 2021.”

Today, learned State counsel on instructions from SI Jaspal Singh has stated that pursuant to the order dated 26.11.2021, the petitioner has joined investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

In view of above, the interim order dated 26.11.2021 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

The petition stands disposed off.
