The petitioner has prayed for grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.74 dated 09.10.2021 registered under Sections 306, 34 of IPC at Police Station Patara, District Jalandhar.

On 23.11.2021, following order was passed:-

Submits inter alia that the Petitioner happens to be brother-in-law (wife's brother-in-law of the deceased Rajesh Kumar), and therefore stands on a similar footing with co-accused Ranjit @ Gora and his wife Jasvir Kaur, who were admitted to interim bail by this Court in CRM-M-45530-2021 on 29.10.2021.

Notice of motion.

Mr. B.S. Sewak, Addl. Advocate General, Punjab to accept notice on behalf of the Respondent/State. A copy of the paper-book be handed over to him.

To come up along with CRM-M-45530-2021 on 14.01.2022.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest of the Petitioner by the Arresting Officer, he shall be released on interim bail subject to the following conditions:-

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1 That he shall make himself available for interrogation by a Police Officer as and when required;

2 That he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any Police Officer and;

3 That he shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.

Today, learned State counsel on instructions from SI Jaspal Singh has stated that pursuant to the order dated 23.11.2021, the petitioner has joined investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

In view of above, the interim order dated 23.11.2021 passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

The petition stands disposed off.
