Case heard via video conferencing.

On 02.12.2021, the following order had been passed by this court:-

“By this petition, the petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail, upon FIR no.52, dated 6.6.2018, having been registered at Police Station Kamboj, District Amritsar Rural, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under Sections 302/148/149 of the IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Learned counsel for the petitioner points to Annexure P-2 which is a 'blood report' from a private laboratory, a prescription issued by a doctor in a private hospital and a bill issued by the Christian Medical College and Hospital, Ludhiana, showing that the petitioner was admitted to the hospital on 7.10.2021 and discharged on 8.10.2021 (with him having left against medical advice) but with no medical prescription of that hospital on record; though as per the laboratory report; dated 6.10.2021, his platelets count is shown to be only 55,000 against the minimum of 1.5 lac mm³.

The contention is that he was suffering from dengue fever.

He further submits that the petitioner was absent only on 12.10.2021 on account of his aforesaid medical condition and that he has never jumped bail earlier.

Notice of motion.

Mr.Rana Harjasdeep Singh, learned DAG, Punjab, accepts notice at the asking of the court. Adjourned to 1.2.2022.

A gazetted officer is directed to file a reply to the petition.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner upon surrendering before the learned trial court would be admitted to interim bail to the complete satisfaction of that court, with that court to also send a report to this court as to whether the petitioner had ever earlier also misused the concession of bail or not.”

A report dated 21.12.2021 has been placed on record, received from the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Amritsar, stating to the effect that the petitioner surrendered before that court on 17.12.2021 and has been released on interim bail to the satisfaction of that court.

It has also been stated that as per record of that court, he was absent only on 12.10.2021 and has never mis-used the concession of bail earlier.

That being so, for the reasons already stated in the order dated 02.12.2021, the petition is allowed with the said order made absolute, on the same terms and conditions.
