[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, AnnexureP-1, dated 14.05.2019, in CWP No.17683 of 2014.

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1) dated 14.05.2019, reveals that CWP No.17683 of 2014, was disposed of, impugned orders dated 07.04.2010 and 30.07.2014 were set aside and the respondents were directed to grant the benefit of ACP to petitioner No.1 w.e.f. 01.11.2006. Petitioner No.1 was also held entitled to arrears of salary owing to the re-fixation of their pay scales along with interest @ 6% per annum with effect from the date of their entitlement till actual date of disbursement with needful to be done within 03 months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

[3] Learned counsel for the petitioners states that the deceased petitioner's LRs have been released the benefits as per entitlement of the petitioner in terms of order (Annexure P-1) dated 14.05.2019 in CWP No.17683 of 2014, therefore, the LR's of the deceased petitioner are not

interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[4] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the LR’s of the deceased petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
