Through the instant petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C., the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No. 49 dated 12.02.2020, registered under Section 323, 506, 427, 34, 120-B IPC, and Sections 325 and 307 IPC added later on, at Police Station Division No. 2, District Ludhiana.

Vide order dated 03.12.2021 passed by this Court, *ad interim* anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to the aforesaid order dated 03.12.2021, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Sikander Singh, submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for any further investigation.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 03.12.2021 granting *ad interim* anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.

Learned State counsel prays to direct the petitioner to come present, when his Narco Analysis Test is to be conducted.

Learned counsel for the petitioner undertakes that the petitioner will comply with the directions.

The petitioner is directed to be present as and when called for his Narco Analysis Test.
