This is a petition that has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus or any other writ or order or direction to be issued to respondent No.4 to enter the name of the petitioner in the register of Haryana State Pharmacy Council and issue a licence to the petitioner to run his pharmacy.

Petitioner herein got admission in B. Pharmacy in Alwar Pharmacy College, Alwar, under Rajasthan University which is a recognized University from the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI). On completing his pharmacy course, the petitioner submitted his application form for registration along with requisite fee and documents while paying an amount of Rs.4,170/- and Rs.1,020/-. As the pharmacy registration

licence was not issued to him, the instant writ petition has been filed.

On notice, appearance has been caused on behalf of the respondents.

Learned counsel for respondent Nos.3 and 4 would submit that instant petition has rendered infructuous as the registration licence has already been issued to the petitioner herein as far back as on 21.12.2021.

There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner today. However, in view of the statement made by learned counsel for respondent Nos.3 and 4, the instant petition is dismissed as having rendered infructuous. It would be open for the petitioner herein to approach this Court, if any grievance still exists.
