This is an application filed under Section 151 C.P.C. for placing on record the written statement.

The petitioner has filed this petition under Articles 226 & 227 of the Constitution of India, for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the order dated 12.07.2019 (Annexure P-1) passed by the concerned respondent wherein the petitioner has been ordered to be transferred.

It is submitted by counsel for the respondent-UOI that the petitioner had challenged the impugned transfer order on the ground of

posting on compassionate basis; on account of illness of his father. The petitioner was granted interim order by this court. With the afflux of time even the permissible duration of compassionate posting has expired now. Hence the present petition deserves to be dismissed.

Since the present case relates to transfer only and the reason for which this court had interfered in the matter and the interim order was granted in favour of the petitioner, also stands exhausted, therefore, this court does not find any ground to continue with the present petition.

In view of the above the present petition is dismissed.

All the pending applications, if any, stand disposed of accordingly.
