The appellant has come up in appeal against the order dated 29.05.2018 whereby petition filed by the husband under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 for dissolution of marriage by a decree of divorce has been allowed.

On 25.05.2022, the appellant-Sonia and the respondent-Rajesh Chauhan were present in Court and they made their respective statements. As per the statement of the appellant, she has received Rs.6 Lacs from the respondent-husband as permanent alimony towards her past, present and future maintenance. Out of the said amount a sum of Rs.3,00,000/- has already been received by her in the shape of FDR in favour of her minor daughter Mannat. The remaining amount of Rs.3,00,000/- in cash has been received by her on 25.05.2022. Parties

shall remain bound by the terms of settlement/compromise dated 30.03.2022 and undertake to comply with the terms of the above settlement agreement. They will withdraw all pending litigation before any court of law, against each other. Appellant -wife have also undertaken to vacate the matrimonial house on or before 16.08.2022.

As per order dated 25.05.2022, appellant-wife sought time to vacate the matrimonial home. Thereafter, the case was adjourned six time for this purpose.

Today, status report by way of affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sirsa has been filed by the State counsel and the same is taken on record.

As per the status report, statements of Rajesh Chauhan, Raj Rani and Sonia Chauhan, dated 09.11.2022 have been recorded and annexed as Annexure R-1 to R-3.

As per the statement of Sonia, Annexure R-3, on 08.11.2022, she has vacated the house of her husband, Rajesh Chauhan in Vishnupuri Colony, Sirsa. She has bought a house separately.

Keeping in view the compromise effected between the parties and since the house has been vacated by the appellant no further order is required to be passed in the matter.

Appeal stands disposed of.
