[1] Prayer in the instant petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 31.05.2022 in CWP No.12347 of 2022 in case titled as Bhupinder Singh vs. State of Punjab and others.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP No.12347 of 2022 was disposed of by directing the respondent herein to pass appropriate speaking order on legal notice dated 11/14.03.2022 filed by the petitioner within eight weeks from the date of receipt of copy of the order.

[3] Pursuant to the issuance of notice to the respondent, learned counsel for the respondent has filed short reply by way of affidavit on behalf of the respondent along with copy of speaking order, Annexure R/1 dated 25.11.2022 holding that the petitioner cannot be given the amount for the uniform for the period 2018 and 2019 after his retirement. The aforementioned affidavit as well as speaking order, Annexure R/1 dated 25.11.2022 are taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel

for the petitioner who on perusal thereof states that in the circumstances, he does not press the instant petition but prays for grant of liberty to the petitioner to challenge order, Annexure R/1 dated 25.11.2022 by way of appropriate proceedings in accordance with law.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instantpetition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
