The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking issuance of directions to official respondents No.2 to 4 not to conduct multiple inquiries into complaint (Annexure P-6) filed by respondent No.5.

It is pleaded in the petition that initially a complaint was filed by respondent No.5 against the petitioners and after conducting the inquiry, the same was filed by the authorities concerned. Again an application dated 21.07.2021 on the same set of allegations, has been submitted by respondent No.5 and therefore, the petitioners approached this Court for restraining the official respondents from conducting multiple inquiries against them.

In compliance of order dated 21.12.2021, status report by way of affidavit of DSP Jagraon, District Ludhiana (Rural) on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4 has been filed and the same is taken on record.

In the aforesaid status report, it has been mentioned that respondent No.5 has given a statement on 29.01.2022 before the Enquiry Officer to the effect that efforts are being made for compromise with the opposite party and on account of the same, respondent No. 5 does not want any action to be taken on his application and the same may be closed.

In view of the above, no more action is required to be taken and accordingly, the instant petition stands disposed of.
