After arguing for a while, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks permission to withdraw the instant petition while submitting that the petitioner would be surrendering before the trial Court within three days and will move an appropriate application for seeking the relief of regular bail and he further prays that the trial Court be directed to decide the said bail application of the petitioner within some specific time frame.

Mr. Amitoj Singh Dhaliwal, learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, who has joined the proceedings in this case in pursuance of the copy of the instant petition having been sent to the respondent-State in advance, has no objection to the above-discussed submission as well as the prayer as made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

Resultantly, the petition in hand is hereby dismissed for having been withdrawn. However, in case the petitioner surrenders before the trial Court within the above-referred stipulated period and moves the application for seeking the relief of regular bail, then, the trial Court will decide the same, in accordance with law, in the given set of the facts and circumstances of the matter, within a period of three (03) days.
