This application is for placing on record copy of the compromise dated 17.01.2022 as Annexure A-1.

For the reasons stated in the application, the same is allowed and copy of the compromise dated 17.01.2022 is taken on record subject to all just exceptions.

MAIN CASE

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 129 dated 06.11.2021, under Sections 458, 427, 323, 148, 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Mehna, District Moga.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the alleged occurrence took place on 05.11.2021 between the neighbours, wherein the injuries were allegedly caused by Manjinder Singh @ Kali and Parwinder Singh @ Dhania to the complainant Surinder Singh. He further submits that though the petitioner, who is wife of Manjinder Singh @ Kali, is named in the FIR, but the only attribution is regarding usage of abusive language. He, however, contends that matter has been compromised and settled through the District Mediation Centre, Moga. A copy of the settlement dated 17.01.2022 is taken on record.

This Court, by the order dated 27.12.2021, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation

and in the event of her arrest, she was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Sukhpal Singh, submits that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the above, especially when the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 27.12.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. She shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.

Criminal miscellaneous application also stands disposed of.
