1. Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-1, dated 10.09.2021, in CWP-17912-2021.

2. A perusal of order Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP-17912-2021, was disposed of by directing the respondent to consider legal notice dated 26.06.2021 as representation moved by the petitioners and decide the same in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order preferably within one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order and if the petitioners were held entitled to the benefits claimed and there was no impediment for the release of payment, to release the same to the petitioners without any further delay.

3. Reply has been filed by the respondent along order Annexure R/1 dated 18.08.2022, releasing benefits to the petitioners as per entitlement. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned

counsel for the petitioners, who on perusal thereof states that in view of the needful having been done and benefits as per entitlement having been released to the petitioners pursuant to decision of claim as made in legal notice dated 26.06.2021, the petitioners are not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

4. In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
