Case is taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Prayer in the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for directing respondents No. 2 and 3 to take appropriate legal action in accordance with law and also to conduct fair and impartial investigation in FIR No. 261 dated 07.09.2021, registered under Sections 454 and 380 IPC, at Police Station Tripuri, District Patiala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that despite the fact of registration of the FIR, no action has been taken by the investigating agency, so far. The petitioner has specifically named, respondent No. 4-Kanchan Rani, that the house was under the supervision of respondent No. 4 and in the absence of family members, she committed the theft.

Notice of motion to the respondent-State only.

On the asking of this Court, learned State counsel accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. She, on the instructions of ASI Charan Singh, submits that the petitioner-complainant failed to produce any substantial evidence regarding the theft committed by respondent No. 4 and during inquiry, all the allegations levelled by the petitioner were found to be false.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above, the present petition is dismissed, as no further orders are called for in the present petition.
