The petitioner had filed an application for partition of the land in dispute. His application was allowed and *sanad* was issued on 28.02.2018. The same was challenged by the private respondents before the learned Financial Commissioner and the revision petition has succeeded. Matter has been remanded to the Assistant Collector for a fresh decision in accordance with law after hearing all the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has vehemently argued that the order passed by the learned Financial Commissioner is not sustainable in law, however, he has not been able to convince this Court.

Thus, the writ petition is without any merit and is dismissed.
