[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-6, dated 04.08.2022, in CRM-M No.33992 of 2022 in case titled as '**Ashok Mehta** versus **State of Punjab and others**'.

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-6) reveals that CRM-M No.33992 of 2022 was dismissed in view of the stand of learned DAG, Punjab, that final police report would be submitted by the competent authority within six weeks.

[3] Today, learned Asstt. AG, Punjab, on instructions from ASI Harjinder Singh, states that final report has been filed in case FIR No.104 dated 28.04.2012 registered under Sections 406, 506 and 34 IPC (wherein the offences under Sections 326, 323, 324, 379, 148 and 149 IPC are stated to have been added later-on) at Police Station Cantonment, Amritsar City, District Amritsar before the learned trial Court on 19.10.2022.

[4] Learned counsel for the petitioner states that in view of the statement by learned Asstt. AG, Punjab, on instructions of ASI Harjinder Singh, he does not press the instant petition.

[5] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
