This is a petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of a writ in the nature of Certiorari for quashing the impugned notification dated 25.10.2022 (Annexure P-7) to the extent of not giving the appointment to the petitioner despite his being there in the select list of even date, with certain other prayers made in the present petition.

Reply on behalf of respondent No.1 is filed in the Court. The same is taken on record.

Learned counsel for respondent No.1 has pointed out that the Central Administrative Tribunal, as duly constituted in Chandigarh, is fully functional now. Therefore, the present petition deserves to be transferred to the Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh Bench.

Accordingly, the present petition is transferred to the Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh for further proceedings, in accordance with law. Let the entire record be sent to Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh.

Since, the matter involves urgency and also the pleadings are stated to be complete, therefore, the Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh is directed to take a final decision in the matter, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of record. The parties are directed to appear before the Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh on 21.12.2022.
