Prayer in the present petition is for setting aside the order dated 06.06.2022 (Annexure P-4) passed by learned Judge, Special Court, Jalandhar vide which the bail the petitioner has been cancelled and bail bonds and surety bonds are forfeited to the State and the petitioner has been summoned through non-bailable warrants in case FIR No. 99, dated 28.09.2019 (Annexure P-1), registered under Sections 353, 186 IPC and Sections 21 and 25 of NDPS Act, registered at Police Station Nakodar City, District Jalandhar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is a case of bail jump on two occasions firstly on 21.07.2022 and thereafter on 05.09.2022 on account of the fact that petitioner was not available and in that eventuality, bail of the petitioner has been cancelled and bail bonds and surety bonds are forfeited to the State and non-bailable warrants of arrest

were issued for 21.07.2022.

Be that as it may, to meet the ends of justice and in the light of the fact that the counsel of the petitioner could not appear on account of urgency arising out of family circumstances as also the fact that no prejudice would be caused to the respondent-State, the petitioner is directed to surrender before the trial within a period of one week from today and apply for regular bail.

In case, such an application for bail is moved by the petitioner before the trial Court after his surrenders, the same shall be considered and decided on the same date, in accordance with law.

The present petition stands disposed of accordingly.
