VINOD S. BHARDWAJ. J (ORAL)

The present writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, 1950 seeking issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release tubewell connection (Agriculture Purpose - AP) in favour of the petitioner on priority basis in the land which has been purchased with the amount of compensation received by the petitioner against his land which was acquired for the construction/setting up of thermal plant at village Banawala, District Mansa.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner contends that the land of the petitioner was acquired for the purposes of

setting up a thermal plant and that as per the Notification issued by the respondent authorities, the petitioner was entitled to release of the tubewell connection (Agriculture Purpose - AP) in favour of the petitioner on priority basis.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Tushaar Madaan, Advocate, accepts notice and files power of attorney on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4. He contends that filing of the present petition is pre-mature inasmuch as the petitioner has alternative efficacious remedy under the Statutory scheme as well as in other regulatory statutes.

Faced with above, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner seeks permission to withdraw the instant writ petition with liberty to take recourse to the statutory/alternative remedies available to the petitioner in accordance with law.

Dismissed as withdraw with liberties as aforesaid.
