[1] Learned AAG on instructions from Sh. Shamsheer Singh, Superintendent, Social Justice and Empowerment Department, Haryana states that retiral benefits have been sanctioned in favour of the petitioner after regularizing the period of absence from 01.03.2014 to 30.06.2014 and payment would be released to the petitioner within four weeks of completion of formalities. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner would attend the office of the respondent at Kurukshetra at 11.00 a.m. on 21.12.2022. On petitioner attending the office of the respondent, requisite formalities be got completed by the respondent and payment as per entitlement be deposited in the bank account of the petitioner within four weeks of completion of formalities, as per account number to be furnished by the petitioner.

[2] In the circumstances, the Contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971. However, liberty is granted to the petitioner to move an application for revival of the contempt petition, if the needful is not done

in the manner as indicated above. In the eventuality of an application for revival being moved, serious view would be taken in the matter.

[3] Learned counsel for the petitioner prays for and is also granted liberty to take out appropriate proceedings in accordance with law to seek interest on the delayed release of payment by way of appropriate proceedings in accordance with law.
