Prayer in the instant petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, is for issuance of directions to respondents No. 2 and 3 to provide protection of lives and liberty of the petitioners, who have married against the wishes of private respondents.

Learned counsel for petitioners submits that petitioner No.1 – Muskan, aged about 22 years and petitioner No.2 – Angrajveer Singh, aged about 29 years, have got married on 02.11.2022, against the wishes of their family members, arrayed as respondent No.4. It has been further submitted that private respondents is threatening to interfere in the matrimonial life of petitioners. Hence, petitioners are seeking protection in that regard and have approached this Court by way of filing the instant petition. They have also submitted a representation dated 02.11.2022 (Annexure P-7) to respondent No.2 –Senior Superintendent of Police (Rural), District Ludhiana (Punjab), sent through a registered post dated 10.11.2022, wherein, they have expressed their apprehension.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Anmol Singh Sandhu, AAG,

Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondent Nos. 1 to 3 (State).

In view of the above, present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 – Senior Superintendent of Police (Rural), District Ludhiana (Punjab), sent through a registered post dated 10.11.2022, to look into the representation dated 02.11.2022 (Annexure P-7), *qua* threat perception and if there is any substance in it, take necessary steps, in accordance with law, to ensure that lives and liberty of petitioners is not jeopardized at the hands of the private respondent.

However, this direction will not validate the marriage said to have taken place between the parties and will have no effect on any civil or criminal action, which could be initiated in the matter in accordance with law.
