The petitioner has approached this Court impugning the order dated 08.04.2022 passed by the learned trial Court, whereby, non-bailable warrants have been issued against the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is working as a driver and he was granted anticipatory bail on 15.09.2020, however, he was out of station and an application for exemption from personal appearance was filed. He submits that thereafter, now non-bailable warrants have been issued against the petitioner. He submits that the dispute is based on matrimonial discord between the parties. He further submits the petitioner appeared before the learned Addl. Sessions Judge for grant of anticipatory bail, however, the same has been declined vide order dated 16.09.2022. He submits that the petitioner is ready to appear before the Court concerned.

Mr. Sandeep Kumar, Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the State.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, the present is disposed of with a direction that in case the petitioner appears before the Court concerned within 7 days from today and files an appropriate application for redressal of his grievance, then his arrest would remain stayed for 3 days from

the date of filing of the same. The Court concerned would deal with the same in accordance with law. Needless to say that if the petitioner does not appear before the Court concerned, this order would be of no avail to him.
