[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-1, dated 22.08.2022, in CWP-37675-2018 in case titled as 'Shiv Kumar and others versus State of Haryana and others'.

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1) reveals that CWP-37675-2018 was disposed of in the light of stand of learned counsel for the respondent that the objection taken in Annexure A-1 dated 12.12.2019 was hyper technical and was not required to be taken, therefore, claim of the applicant-petitioner(s) would be considered in accordance with law by treating them as Assistant Food and Supply Officer(s) only.

[3] Learned Asstt. AG, Haryana, has produced copy of order dated 12.12.2022, rejecting the claim of the petitioner on merit. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner, who states that in the circumstances, she does not press the instant petition but

prays for grant of liberty to the petitioner to challenge order dated 12.12.2022 by way of appropriate proceedings, in accordance with law.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
