HARSIMRAN SINGH SETHI J. (ORAL)

Learned counsel for the petitioner argues that the military service, which the petitioner had rendered from the year 1964 to 1976, has not been taken into account for calculating the pensionary benefits of the petitioner by the respondents.

Learned counsel for respondent No.3 submits that keeping in view the averments made in Paragraph No.4 of the reply, all the benefits, including the benefits in respect of the military service rendered by the petitioner, for which he was found entitled for, have already been extended in favour of the petitioner, and therefore as of now, no other benefits need to be granted to the petitioner, over and above the benefits already extended in his favour by the respondent-Department.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though

respondent No.3 has mentioned in the reply that all the benefits have

already been released to the petitioner, but the petitioner be given liberty to approach the respondent-Department by filing an appropriate representation, in case any of the benefits still remain to be released to him by the respondent-Department.

Learned counsels for the respondents submit that in case, any such representation is filed by the petitioner before the respondents, the same will be considered in accordance with law and an appropriate speaking order will be passed by the authorities concerned within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of such representation and after the decision, if the petitioner is found entitled for the grant of any benefit, the same will also be released to him within a period of four weeks thereafter.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that keeping in view the submissions of learned counsels for the respondents, as recorded hereinbefore, no further grievance of the petitioner survives in the present petition at this stage and the same may kindly be disposed of as having been not pressed any further at this stage.

Ordered accordingly.
