[1] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner, who is a senior citizen has instituted execution proceedings before the Court of the Learned District Judge, Faridkot qua arbitration award, Annexure P/1 dated 07.05.2019 in Arbitration Case No.688 of 2016 titled as Gurnam Singh vs. Govt. of India and others, therefore does not press the instant petition but prays for grant of liberty to the petitioner to pursue the execution petition filed before the Court of the Learned District Judge, Faridkot and issuance of directions to the learned Executing Court to conclude the proceedings in respect thereto expeditiously.

[2] In view of the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while granting liberty to the petitioner to pursue the execution proceedings before the Court of the Learned District Judge, Faridkot. Needless to mention, the Learned District Judge, Faridkot would endeavor to decide the execution

proceedings in accordance with law as expeditiously as possible, keeping in view the fact that the petitioner is more than 75 years of age and execution proceedings pertain to arbitration case No.688 of 2016 which was decided vide award, Annexure P/1 dated 07.05.2019.
