[1] Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 09.07.2014 in CWP No.1775 of 2005 in case titled as Harminder Kaur vs. State of Punjab and Ors.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP No.1775 of 2005 was disposed of in terms of order dated 09.09.2013 passed in CWP No.15618 of 2004 in case titled as Gurcharan Kaur vs. The State of Punjab and another wherein the respondents were directed to grant the benefit of scales applicable to the post for government servants to the petitioner(s) with arrears, if any, to be calculated within 12 weeks and released to the petitioner(s) and in case needful was not done within the stipulated period of time, the petitioner(s) were held entitled to recover the same with interest at the rate of 6%.

[3] Vide order dated 11.02.2020, learned counsel for the petitioner sought time to cite law to make out that the instant petition is

within limitation as per provisions of Section 20 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.

[4] Today, learned counsel for the petitioner states that benefits as per entitlement in terms of order, Annexure P/1 have been released to the petitioner, therefore, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[5] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner but without commenting upon the maintainability of the instant petition, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
