ORAL ORDER

2 22-02-2023 Heard the parties.

The case is registered under Sections 395 of the
Indian Penal Code in connection with Sursand P.S. Case No.57
of 2021.

Earlier the matter was rejected by this Court on
17.05.2022 passed in Cr. Misc. No.59880 of 2021.

Taking into account the period of custody
(19.06.2021) which has been incorporated in para-8 of the
petition, this Court is inclined to extend him privilege of bail
subject to strict condition considering the criminal antecedent
that he has.

Let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing
bail bond of Rs.10,000/-(Rupees Ten Thousand) with two
sureties of the like amount each in connection with Sursand P.S.



Case No.57 of 2021 to the satisfaction of learned Additional Sessions Judge, XV, Sitamarhi, subject to following conditions:

(i) one of the bailor should be the family member of the petitioner who shall provide official document to show his/her bona fide;

(ii) the petitioner shall appear on each and every date before the Trial court and failure to do so for two consecutive dates without plausible reason will entail cancellation of his/her bail bond by the Trial court itself;

(iii) the petitioner shall leave his/her district (Sitamarhi) for a period of three month(s) after providing name and address and police station of his place of stay during the said period and he shall be duty bound to visit the police station concerned (where he will stay) every week to mark his attendance;

(iv) upon return to his district, he shall visit the concerned police station every fortnight for the next six months to mark attendance;

(v) the petitioner shall in no way try to induce or promise or threat the witnesses or tamper with the evidences, failing which the State shall be at liberty to take steps for cancellation of the bail bonds;



(vi) the petitioner shall desist from committing any criminal offence again failing which the State shall be at liberty to take steps for cancellation of the bail bonds.
