2      03-04-2023      Learned counsel for the petitioner states that though the petitioner not being an industrial dealer, under Clause 32(A) of the Fertilizer (Inorganic, Organic or Mixed) (Control) Order, 1985, an appeal would lie against the impugned order, whereby the licence of the petitioner has been cancelled, but while cancelling the licence of the petitioner, the principles of natural justice have not been followed, as the record was not made



available to the petitioner for filing his reply to the show cause.

As such, the present writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to file an appeal before the appropriate authority, which will be disposed of considering all the aspects of the petitioner, within a period of thirty days from its filing.
