In paragraph '20' of the writ application, a statement has been made that being aggrieved by and dissatisfied with the order of dismissal, the petitioner has filed a departmental appeal before the Additional Director General of Police (Budget, Welfare and Appeal), Bihar, Patna on 13.04.2022 which is still pending.



Learned counsel for the petitioner informed this Court that his appeal has been sent to the ADG, Police, Training Academy, Rajgir for consideration.

Learned counsel prays for a direction to the competent appellate authority to consider the appeal of the petitioner in accordance with law and pass a reasoned order.
