2 23-06-2023 The present writ petition has been filed seeking the following relief:-

“1. That this is an application for issuance of an appropriate writ (s)/ order (s), for quashing the original order dated 14.11.08 passed by the then Respondent no. 6 as well as the order dated 18.04.11 passed by the Respondent no. 5 which has been served upon the petitioner in the month of



May 2012 and for consequential relief (s) for which the petitioner is found entitled to.”

At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioner to assail the aforesaid order of punishment dated 14.11.2008 and the appellate order dated 18.04.2011, rejecting his appeal, by referring appropriate revision petition. Liberty so sought is granted.
