Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that reliefs claimed by the petitioners are fully covered by the judgment of a Division Bench of this Court passed in LPA No.



43 of 2015 and its analogous cases filed by the similarly situated persons.

The learned counsel for the *Sanskrit Shiksha Board* as well as State do not dispute this position. However, learned counsel for the State submits that a review application has been preferred for review of the order passed in LPA No. 43 of 2015 and its analogous cases reported in 2020 (3) PLJR 848.
