2 30-11-2023 The present writ has been filed seeking the following relief:-

“1(i). For issuance of an appropriate writ in the nature of MANDAMUS, commanding and directing the Respondent Authorities for conversion of petitioner's cadre from Correspondence Clerk to Accounts Clerk in the Rural Works Department of the State in partial modification to the appointment letter issued in favour of the petitioner under memo no.705 dated 04.07.2011, whereby and whereunder on the



recommendation of District Compassionate Committee, the petitioner was appointed as a Correspondence Clerk in the Respondent Department when the post of Accounts Clerk was already vacant and after the appointment of the petitioner, the Respondents had appointed one Subhash Anand son of Late Shailendra Kumar Singh as an Accounts Clerk though in his favour also there was same recommendation by the District Compassionate Committee.”

2. At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner seeks liberty on behalf of the petitioner to approach the respondent authorities for redressal of his aforesaid grievances. Liberty, so sought, is granted.

3. The writ petition stands disposed off as not pressed.
