2 17-08-2023 1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and
learned APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in anticipation of his
arrest in a case registered for the offences punishable under
Section 30(a) of the Excise Act.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that
the petitioner has antecedent of one case and the allegation is of
recovery of 87 litres of liquor from six places out of which, 12
litres of liquor has been recovered behind the house of the
petitioner.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that
petitioner was not arrested from the spot, as such, nothing was
recovered from his conscious possession and he came to be
implicated based on secret information, which is the easiest way



to implicate someone. It is next submitted that even alleged recovery is from a place, which does not belong to the petitioner and he came to be implicated merely because of the fact that the recovery was made from a place which is adjacent to his house.

5. Learned A.P.P. opposes the bail application.

6. Considering the submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, the petitioner, above-named, in the event of his arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of six weeks, is directed to be released on bail on his furnishing bail-bonds in the sum of Rs. 5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Exclusive Special Excise Judge-2nd, Saran at Chhapra in connection with Manjhi P. S. Case No.84 of 2022, subject to the conditions laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

7. The application stands allowed.
