ORAL ORDER

2 25-04-2023 Heard both the parties.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in anticipation of his arrest in connection with Chandramandih P.S. Case No. 89/2022, dated 21.05.2022, instituted for the offences under Section 366 of the I.P.C.

3. Learned APP for the State opposes the prayer for grant of bail.

4. Taking into consideration the allegations of the lady, who is a major and was having love relationship with the accused and has gone with him of her own free will and that the relationship became sour on account of which, the petitioner has refused to get married to the lady. The contents of the F.I.R. alleging rape do not, *prima facie*, appear to be correct.



5. Without further commenting on the merits of the case, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, namely Bharat Verma, and in the event of arrest, he shall be released on bail, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C., which are held as under:-

(i) The petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation and make himself available for interrogation whenever required.

(ii) The petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any witness acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer,

(iii) The petitioner shall not obstruct or hamper the police investigation and not play mischief with the evidence collected or yet to be collected by the police;

(iv) The petitioner shall maintain law and order;

(v) The petitioner shall, at the time of execution of the bond, furnish his address and mobile number to the investigating officer, and the court concerned, and shall not change the residence till the final disposal of the case;

(vi) The petitioner shall surrender his passport, if any, before the investigating officer within a week and, if he does not



possess any passport, he shall file an affidavit to that effect before the investigating officer;

(vii) The petitioner shall regularly remain present during the trial and cooperate with the Hon’ble Court to complete the trial for the above offences.
