2 24-02-2023 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as
learned APP for the State.

The petitioners apprehend their arrest in a case registered for the offence punishable under Sections 363 (B), 366 (A), 376 and 120 (B) of the Indian Penal Code.

The prosecution case in short is that all the accused persons including the petitioners took away the daughter of the complainant in their house and thereafter, co-accused Ranjan Kumar made physical relation with her and ouster her after torturing from their house. It is alleged that when the complainant came to the house of the petitioners, they also



assaulted her with fists and slaps and also refused to keep her daughter at their house.

It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioners that petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence. They have been falsely implicated in this case. No such occurrence, in the manner as alleged, has ever taken place. The allegation levelled against the petitioners is not specific rather general and omnibus in nature. The specific allegation is against co-accused Ranjan Kumar. There is no specific overt act against the petitioners. He further submits that similarly situated co-accused persons have been granted bail by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court vide order dated 06.07.2022 passed in Cr. Misc. No.64309 of 2021. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent, as also mentioned in para-3 of the bail application.

Learned APP for the State opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, let the above named petitioners, be released on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of six weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) **each** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned



court below where the case is pending/Successor Court in connection with Complaint Case No.2487 of 2017, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.
