2 29-11-2023 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned
Additional Public Prosecutor for the State.

2. The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in a
case registered for the offence punishable under Sections 420,
34 of the Indian Penal Code.

3. Allegation against the petitioners is that they
fraudulently transfer of property with conspiracy by preparing
fake document.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that
the petitioners are innocent and have been falsely implicated in



this case. He submits that the petitioner nos. 1 and 3 are purchaser and petitioner no. 2 is the witness on the registered sale deed. He submits that the partition suit between the parties is pending before the learned court below. He submits that the present dispute is purely civil in nature. He further submits that petitioners have criminal antecedents as stated in para-3 of the bail application.

5. Learned APP for the State and learned counsel for the opposite party no. 2 oppose the prayer for bail.

6. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, let the above named petitioners in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of six weeks from today, be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below where the case is pending/successor court in connection with Complaint Case No. 1690 of 2015, subject to the condition as laid down under Section 438 (2) of the Cr.P.C.
