2 06-12-2023 Heard Mr. V.M.K. Sinha, learned counsel on behalf of the

petitioners as well as Mr. Dilip Kumar No.1, learned APP on behalf

of the State.

2. The petitioners apprehend their arrest in a case registered
for the offence punishable under Sections 323 and 354 of the Indian
Penal Code.

3. Allegedly, the petitioners along with other co-accused
persons armed with deadly weapons were filling water in the ditch
field of the complainant. When the complainant and her mother-in-
law protested, the accused persons including the petitioners assaulted
them.



4. It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioners that petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence. They have been falsely implicated in this case. No such occurrence, in the manner as alleged, has ever taken place. He submits that after investigation, police filed final form against the petitioners but protest petition has been filed on behalf of the informant and on that protest petition a complaint case No.127 of 2018 has been filed against the petitioners. Petitioners have six criminal antecedent.

5. Learned APP for the State opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

6. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, let the above named petitioners, be released on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of six weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) **each** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below where the case is pending/Successor Court in connection with Complaint Case No.127 of 2018, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.
