In Re: - An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with GR Case No.146 of 2023 arising out of **Belda** Police Station Case No.**63 of 2023** dated **01.02.2023** under Sections **447/323/325/307/354B/506/34** of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

Petitioners pray for anticipatory bail.

There is a prior police complaint pending.

Apparently, the victim suffered blunt injury on the head.

Apparently, there are disputes between the family members.

In such circumstances, we deem it appropriate to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a Bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on condition that the petitioners will report before the Investigating Officer once a month till the conclusion of the investigation and on condition that the petitioners shall appear on every date before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in

default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioners in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners is allowed.

C.R.M. (A) 1154 of 2023 is, thus, disposed of.
