In Re: - An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Joypur** Police Station Case No.**70 of 2023** dated **14.03.2023** under Sections **448/325/326/354/307/34** of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

Petitioner prays for anticipatory bail.

Apparently, two persons suffered injuries in the present police complaint.

The doctor noted that the injuries were suffered out of the physical assault over head. Although, it is claimed in the 161 statement that an arm was broken of the one of the injured, the same was not corroborated by the medical evidence. None of the injuries were classified as grievous hurt.

In such circumstances, we grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a Bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on condition that the petitioner will report before the Investigating Officer once a fortnight till the conclusion of the investigation and on condition that the petitioner

shall appear on every date before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioner in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is allowed.

C.R.M. (A) 1823 of 2023 is, thus, disposed of.
