The writ petitioner retired from service on superannuation as a librarian of Mondalpur Sanskritik Parishad, Paschim Bardhaman on November 30, 2017. After her retirement, the first pension payment order was issued by the authority concerned on January 18, 2018. Thereafter, since ROPA 2019 came into force on September 16, 2020, the revised pension payment order was issued on February 22, 2022.

The petitioner's case is that though ROPA 2019 was implemented on September 16, 2020, she received the pensionary benefits in terms of the revised pension payment order on February 22, 2022. Hence she seeks a direction upon the concerned authority to pay interest to her for the belated payment of gratuity and arrear pension.

Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that getting the pensionary benefits is the legal right of the petitioner and that the pensionary amount is not a bounty of the employer. He also submits that as per the nationalised savings scheme for the senior citizens, any deposit made by a senior citizen now carries interest at the rate of 8% p.a. He further submits that had the petitioner received her pensionary benefits in time, the amount which

she would have received would carry interest at the rate of 8% p.a. As such, learned counsel prays for interest at the rate of 8% p.a. for the belated payment of pensionary amount.

Having heard learned counsels appearing for the respective parties and on consideration of the documents annexed to the writ petition, I feel that the writ petition may be disposed of by passing the following direction.

Accordingly, the concerned respondent, especially the third respondent – the Treasury Officer, Asansol-I – is directed to pay interest to the petitioner at the rate of 8% p.a. on the delayed payment of gratuity and arrear pension from September 16, 2020 till the date of final payment, within six weeks from the date of communication of this order.

With the aforesaid direction, WPA No.11815 of 2023 stands disposed of. No order as to costs.

All parties are to act on the server copy of this order duly downloaded from the official website of this court.
