In Re:- An application for bail under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with Naihati G. R. P. S. Case No.25 of 2023 dated 22.05.2023 under Sections 498A/306/406/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Petitioners are the parents-in-law of the victim housewife. They are in custody for 41 days. They pray for bail.

Learned Advocate for the State opposes the bail prayer.

We have considered the materials on record. Allegations against the petitioners are general and omnibus. Principal accused i.e. the husband is in custody.

Keeping in mind the aforesaid facts, we are inclined to grant bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, the petitioners viz., Tarak Nath Mishra and Lila Mishra shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sealdah, South 24-Paraganas subject to condition that they shall appear before the trial court on every date of hearing until further orders and

shall not intimidate witnesses or tamper with evidence in any manner whatsoever.

In the event the petitioners fail to appear before the Trial Court without any justifiable cause, the trial Court shall be at liberty to cancel their bail in accordance with law without further reference to this Court.

The application for bail is, thus, disposed of.
