1. By this writ petition the petitioner seeks for a direction upon the 3rd respondent, namely, the University of Burdwan to conduct Entrance Examination for admission to the 5-year BA, LLB Course.

2. On an earlier occasion this court had dealt with an identical issue and had passed an order in WPA(P) 152 of 2023 dated 17.04.2023.

3. In the said order the submission made on behalf of the respondent University was noted wherein they have undertaken that they will revert back to the original procedure of conducting Entrance Examination for admission for the 5-year BA, LLB Course from the academic session commencing from 2024. The

petitioner has annexed the notification dated 30.06.2023 which is for the academic session 2023-28.

4. The learned advocate appearing for the 3rd respondent, namely, the University of Burdwan has produced a copy of the notification dated 14th August, 2023, which reads as follows:

Admn.(2023-24)/58 dated 30.06.2023 of this University, this is to inform you that, in compliance with the order of the Hon’ble Division Bench of Calcutta High Court dated 17.04.2023 passed in W.P.A.(P) 152 of 2023, this University will conduct Entrance Examination for admission to the 5 year B.A. LL.B. course for the academic session commencing from the year 2024.
