Affidavit of service filed in Court today be retained with the records.

The writ petitioner was a permanent employee of the Durgapur Projects Limited (in short, DPL) which is a Government of West Bengal enterprise. She resigned from service from February 26, 2020.

Mr. Sarkar, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the writ petitioner prays for earned leave of 56.5 days, which has not been paid till date. He further prays for interest on the earned leave, due and payable to the writ petitioner.

The number of days of earned leave, due and payable to the petitioner is not in dispute.

The issue has been squarely settled by various Judgements passed by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Hon'ble Court.

Relying on the judgements on the same issue and considering the facts of the case it is directed that the writ petitioner is entitled to earned leave of 56.5 days and interest thereon @ 6% per annum from February 27, 2020 till the date on which the actual payment is made.

The respondent authority/DPL is directed to pay the aforesaid payment within six months from date.

With the directions aforesaid, the writ petition, being **WPA 20067 of 2023**, is **disposed of**.

Since no affidavits have been called for in the writ petition, the allegations contained therein be deemed not to have been admitted by the respondents.

Needless to mention, in case the petitioner has occupied the quarter granted by the employer after her resignation the occupation charges for the said quarter will be deducted from the retiral benefits that the petitioner is entitled to as per the extant rules and policies of the employer/DPL.
