1. Petitioners submit they are not the principal accused. Dispute has broken out between the son of petitioner no. 1 and his father-in-law. They have been falsely implicated. They pray for anticipatory bail.
2. Learned lawyer for the State opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.
3. We have considered the materials on record. Petitioners are not the principal accused.
4. Keeping in mind the extent of their complicity in the crime we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
5. Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs. 10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.
6. Petitioners shall appear before the court below and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date.

7. The application being CRM (A) 4581 of 2023 is disposed of.
