In re : An Application for **Anticipatory Bail** under Section **438** of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with Special Case No. **57** of **2022** arising out of **Kaliachak** Police Station Case No. **397** of **2022** dated **16.04.2022** under Sections **21(c)/27(A)/29** of the Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (NDPS ACT)

No narcotic was recovered from the possession of the petitioner. The police are unable to demonstrate any nexus between the petitioner and the person arrested with the commercial quantity of narcotics and/or the seized commercial quantity of narcotics. The police are proceeding against the petitioner on the basis of the statements of the co-accused made while in custody.

Police filed charge sheet.

In such circumstances, we are of the view that the petitioner is able to rebut the presumption under Section 37 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Consequently, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting

officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear on every date before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioner in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is **allowed**.

CRM (A) 5988 of 2022 is disposed of.
