C. R. M. (NDPS) 2025 of 2023

In Re: An application for bail under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure filed on 07.12.2023 in connection with Hili Police Station Case No.171 of 2023 dated 17.09.2023 under Sections 21(c)/22(c)/23(c)/27A of the NDPS Act.

1. It is submitted on behalf of the petitioner that he is in custody for about 91 days. Accordingly, he prays for bail.
2. Learned Advocate for the State opposes the prayer for bail.
3. We have considered the materials on record. Amount of narcotics i.e. 49 gms. of *Yaba* tablets recovered from the petitioner is below commercial quantity. In view of the aforesaid fact and the period of detention suffered by the petitioner, we are of the opinion further detention of the accused/petitioner is not necessary.
4. Therefore, the accused/petitioner, namely **Sushanta Sarkar**, be released on bail upon furnishing bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only), with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the learned Judge, Special Court under the NDPS Act-cum-Additional District & Sessions Judge, 3rd Court, Dakshin Dinajpur at Balurghat subject to condition that the said petitioner shall appear before the trial court on every date of hearing until further orders and shall not intimidate witnesses or

tamper with evidence in any manner whatsoever or commit similar offences in future.

5. In the event he fails to appear before the trial court without any justifiable cause, the trial court shall be at liberty to cancel his bail automatically without reference to this court.
6. The application for bail, thus, stands allowed.
