2. Issue notice to respondents. Learned A.G.P. waives service for all the respondents.
3. Heard rival submissions.
4. The respective applicants are seeking condonation of delay periods mentioned in these applications, which appear to be caused due to their poor financial condition.
5. The learned AGP strongly opposed the applications on the ground that no reasonable cause is mentioned for condoning the delay periods.
