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PER COURT :-

Order in delay condonation applications :-

1. By these applications, the applicant seeks to condone the delay caused in filing the appeal against the award passed by the Reference Court.
2. Learned advocate appearing for the applicant invites attention of this Court to the reasons as mentined in paragraph nos.3 to 5. She would submit that the delay has been occurred due to the procedural aspect and administrative compliances. The reasons are made out to condone the delay.
