PER COURT:

1. The learned Advocate for the Petitioner places on record a copy of the Online “Service Book Status - For Employee”, which indicates the name of the Petitioner, his Sevaarth Employee ID and the remark that the service book is cleared and ready for delivery, pursuant to the verification on 23/03/2023. The same is taken on record and marked as ‘X’ for identification.
2. The learned Advocate for the Petitioner submits that, the petition was filed because the retiral benefits were stopped.

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There was no legal impediment. There was no charge levelled upon the Petitioner. There was no disciplinary enquiry against him.
