1. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks leave to amend to mask the name of the respondent No.3/prosecutrix and replace it with an alphabet not only in the cause title but wherever it appears in the petition. Leave granted. Amendment to be carried out forthwith.

2. By this petition, the petitioner seeks quashing of the FIR bearing C.R. No. 313 of 2018 registered with the Arnala Police

Station, Palghar, for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 376 and 420 of the Indian Penal Code. Quashing is sought on the premise, that the parties have amicably settled their dispute.
